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## CNY Circulation Statistics

As anyone who has tried to access the consortium-wide circulation statistics reports knows, the present interface can be somewhat difficult to use. **Tom Keays** at Le Moyne College has very kindly provided the CNY office with links he created to facilitate report retrieval until the next iteration of the interface is made available.

This resource is now available on the CNY "[For Staff](#)" page under "Statistics." The links are broken down by report type (Requests, Fulfillments, Cancellations, and Transfers) and then by date range (User-Specified, Year-to-Date, Last Month, Current Month, and Last Week).

Those wishing to utilize the User-Specified Date reports will need to review the bolded note at the top of the Statistics toggle for information on how to enter the date range as the Java-based navigation tools do not appear.

## **Committee Updates: Shared Print Trust Management**

CNY's Shared Print Trust program includes two cohorts today: "Pod 1," which includes 11 current members, and an "EAST cohort" that includes 5 of the Pod 1 libraries and 2 more members. An analysis was performed by the Sustainable Collections Services (SCS) and retention commitments were assigned to the Pod 1 libraries in 2014. EAST retention commitments were assigned in 2016.

A CNY committee oversees the shared print trust. The CNY Shared Print Trust Management Committee will:

- Assess the effectiveness of the shared print trust program;
- Track developments and emerging trends in this field and share new ideas about best practices with the CNY community;
- Coordinate and communicate retention and review decisions for each CNY Trust project;
- Form sub-committees and/or project task forces as needed to work on specific project and functions related to the CNY Shared Print Trust.

To begin assessing the program, the committee will circulate a survey to each participating library in the near future.

## **ACRL/NY 2017 Symposium**

On December 1<sup>st</sup>, CNY's very own Pam Jones participated as a panelist in a discussion on the mission of the academic library in the twenty-first century at the ACRL/NY 2017 Symposium hosted by Baruch College. Pam was able to share with the audience how membership in consortia like ConnectNY can offer expanded access to important resources and provide staff with remarkable opportunities for professional development.

The Symposium also offered a number of breakout sessions, poster presentations, and another panel discussion on preserving endangered content. We hope those of you who were able to attend found the event to be both enjoyable and informational!
